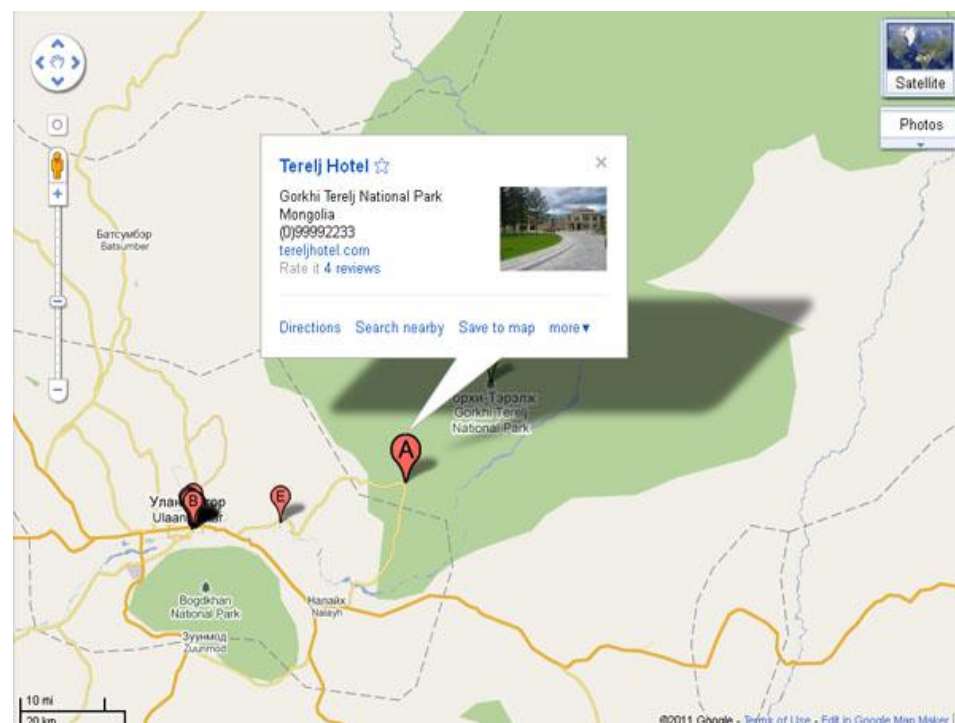

TRANSPORT TO THE VENUE

For the delegation arriving at the Chingis Khan international airport, transport for delegation to the venue will be arranged by the Mongolia Immigration Agency. Also, the delegation will be met by the MIA staff at the VIP room on the 1st floor or business lounge on the 2nd floor of the airport.

For the delegation arriving at night flight ad-hoc transport arrangements can be made. For those who wish to stay in hotels in Ulan Bator, a shuttle bus will be arranged 6-7 September 2011.

On the occasion of the 10th ASEM Conference of the Immigration Directors General, discount rates will be applied. All rates are excluding taxes and service charges (10% VAT and 5% Service Charge) on Rooms (10% VAT and 5% Service Charge) and on Food and Beverage. MONGOLIA IN BRIEF

Official Name: MONGOLIA

Capital City: [Ulaanbaatar](#), (Ulan Bator) founded in 1639 (pop. 1.2 million)

Government:

Type: Parliamentary Republic.

Independence: gained in 1921; in 1990, democratic reform begun and shift from dependence on the former Soviet Union declared.

Constitutions: 1960 and 12 February 1992.

Geography:

Location: Northern Asia, between China and Russia.

[Area](#): 1 566 500 sq. km. (604 103 sq. mi.); Terrain: vast semi desert and desert plains, grassy steppe, mountains in west and southwest; Gobi Desert in south-central; almost 90% of land area is pasture or desert, of varying usefulness; 1% arable; 9% forested.

Climate: Sharp continental, marked by four seasons. Average summer temperature is +17°C and average winter temperature -26°C.

People:

Nationality: Mongolian(s).

Population: 2.75 million.

Ethnic groups: 85% Mongol (predominantly Khalkha), 7% Turkic (largest group, Kazakh) 4.6% Tungusic, and 3.4% others, including Chinese and Russian.

[Languages](#): Mongolian, Kazakh, Russian, and English.

Religions: Tibetan Buddhist Lamaism 94%, Muslim 6% (primarily in the southwest), and Shamanism.

Literacy: 90%.

Natural resources: Oil, coal, copper, molybdenum, tungsten, phosphates, tin, nickel, zinc, fluor spar, gold, silver, iron.

Agriculture products: Wheat, barley, vegetables, forage crops, sheep, goats, cattle, camels, horses.

Industries: Construction and construction materials; mining (coal, copper, molybdenum, fluor spar, and gold); oil; food and beverages; processing of animal products, cashmere and natural fiber manufacturing.

Entry Requirements

Please note that all participants will require visa except the following countries: Bulgaria, China, Czech Republic, Hungary, India, Japan, Korea (Republic of), Laos, Malaysia, Russia, Romania, Singapore, Slovak, Thailand, Vietnam, and United Kingdom. The diplomatic missions of Mongolia abroad will assist the participants in obtaining visa. The participants from the countries where there is no diplomatic mission of Mongolia may request a visa upon arrival.

Currency

The Mongolian currency is called tögrög (MNT or tugriks) and it is not a convertible hard currency (about 1200 tögrögs to the US dollar).

Electricity

Electricity in Mongolia is 230 Volts, alternating at 50 cycles per second. If you travel to Mongolia with a device that does not accept 230 Volts at 50 Hertz, you will need a voltage converter.

Outlets in Mongolia generally accept 1 type of plug:



Two round pins. If your appliances plug has a different shape, you may need a plug adapter.

Climate

"The climate in Mongolia is full of extremes. Sudden changes from heat to cold, from summer to winter are amazing and hard to bear..." wrote [Roy Chapman Andrews](#), an American paleontologist who ventured to wilderness of the Gobi Desert back in 20s. Indeed, temperatures may fall by 30 degrees not only in a season but also within a fortnight.
