SETTING THE INTERNATIONAL AGENDA FOR eCOMMERCE

eCommerce is transforming the way we live, work, trade, learn, shop and do business.

Countries need to work together on building a truly global framework for eCommerce through sharing knowledge, ideas and best practice, and by agreeing common technology standards and protocol.

Following the enlargement of ASEM, agreed in Hanoi, October 2004, the 4th ASEM conference brings together 38 countries from Asia and Europe.

The conference will be held at ExCeL Conference Centre, London on 21-22 February 2005. Mike O'Brien, the UK Minister of State for Energy and eCommerce, will open the conference, followed by a line up of high profile industry, government and academic speakers.

THE CONFERENCE

The global market of RFID carriers, already around \$1 billion, is expected to grow by 20 - 40% annually, becoming an ubiquitous technology as the range of applications expands. The eLogistics seminar will discuss emerging global standards,

consider convergence issues and demonstrate some of the novel applications now being rolled out.

Paperless Trade

Globally, the total potential savings through converting paper documentation to digital communication could be as much as \$500 billion - or 10% of total product cost. This seminar will demonstrate ways in which data can be exchanged between international business partners and will look at how stepping stones between Asia and Europe are leading to greater interoperability between trading communities and governments.
